 - Can you Partake of Sacrifices to Idols & Partake in the Sacrifice of Christ at the Same Time (vs. 16-19
 - We are Partakers of One Bread, Jesus Christ (vs. 16-17; John 6:25ff; Ephesians 2:1; Romans 6:3-4)
 - Partakers of the Altar An Idol is Nothing Sacrifices to Demons (vs. 18-19; Deuteronomy 32:17; Colossians 3:5)
 - We Cannot Partake of the Lord's Table and the Table of Demons (vs. 20-21; Luke 16:11)

• Don't Provoke the Lord to Jealousy (1 Corinthians 11:27; Hebrews 12:22-29)
